What is PAI 2030?



An initiative that began in 2010 to drive change within the practice of pharmacy at a local level



Set of 59 practice-focused, organization-focused and professional-focused recommendations divided in <u>five</u> primary domains



Goal: To drive pharmacy practice advancement at the local level with tools and recommendations for health-systems



What is PAI 2030? continued

PAI 2030 was designed to foster enhancements in health-system pharmacy practice that:

Leverage the profession's strengths

Optimize the roles of pharmacists and pharmacy technicians

Improve the care of patients who have chronic illnesses

Link with initiatives in healthcare that aim to improve transitions of care and reduce costs

Embrace transformative information technology and therapeutics

Embody patient-centered care

Are consistent with value-based payment for healthcare






Pharmacy Technician Role, Education and Training











<u>Objective</u>: Objective: By 2024, increase the number of health systems with integrated pharmacy services to coordinate effective patient care transitions by 20%.

Other recommendations:

Practice-focused

 Pharmacists integrated within the interdisciplinary team, transitions of care, and providing medication reconciliation and comprehensive medication management

Organization-focused

- 24/7 advanced clinical pharmacy services at health-systems
- Pharmacy led medication reconciliation & medication education
- Integrated pharmacy services across transitions of care (home infusion, specialty pharmacy, community pharmacy, acute care)

Profession-focused

 Pharmacists lead and advocate for comprehensive medication management in all healthcare settings





Objective: By the end of 2024, increase the number of pharmacists in ambulatory care clinics by 20%.

Other recommendations:

Practice-focused

- Increase in credentialing and privileging of pharmacists in health systems to expand scope of practice
- Pharmacist participation in emergency response teams

Organization-focused

- Requirement of residency training as minimum credential for new practitioners
- Board certification proliferation in specialty areas
- Integrated pharmacy services across transitions of care (home infusion, specialty pharmacy, community pharmacy, acute care)

Profession-focused

- Credentialled ambulatory care pharmacists to be considered as primary care providers
- Pharmacy education to cover healthcare reimbursement, payment, business management in all areas of practice





Objective: By 2024, increase by 20% the number of health systems using analytics and technology to reduce the risk of adverse drug events or suboptimal outcomes.

Other recommendations:

Practice-focused

 Development and application of advanced analytics (e.g., machine learning and artificial intelligence) in activities such as risk assessment, monitoring performance metrics, high acuity patient identification, optimizing medication use, and business management.


Organization-focused

- Deployment of telepharmacy to expand pharmacy service availability
- Implementation of technologyrelated medication-use safety standards
- Use technology for ensuring safe sterile compounding procedures.

Profession-focused

 Pharmacy should establish standards for the application of artificial intelligence (AI) in the various steps of the medicationuse process, including prescribing, reviewing medication orders, and assessing medication-use patterns in populations.







Objective: By 2024, increase the number of health systems utilizing pharmacy technicians in advanced roles by 20%.

Other recommendations:

Practice-focused

 Pharmacy technicians should have complete responsibility for advanced technical and supporting activities (e.g., order fulfillment, tech-check-tech, regulatory compliance, supply chain management, diversion prevention, revenue cycle management, patient assistance programs).


Organization-focused

- Completion of ASHP/ACPE-accredited technician education and training program for new hires
- Requirement of Pharmacy Technician Certification Board (PTCB) Certification.
- Foster development for professional pharmacy technician career paths.

Profession-focused

 Development and achievement of a recognized scope of practice for pharmacy technicians in acutecare and ambulatory-care settings.







<u>Objective</u>: Objective: By 2024, increase authority for pharmacists to independently prescribe medications, pursuant to a diagnosis, by 20%.

Other recommendations:

Practice-focused

 Advancement of use of pharmacogenomic information for personalized medication treatment.

Organization-focused

- Pharmacy must be an active and accountable partner in the financial stewardship
- Focus on well-being and resiliency initiatives for staff
- Strive to achieve diversity, equity and inclusion in all pharmacy roles.
- Pharmacist executive leadership and enterprise decision-making

Profession-focused

- Partner with interprofessional organizations to define and delineate practice advances into state and federal laws and regulations to optimize patient care.
- Leverage healthcare models acknowledging pharmacist value and align payment with quality of outcomes




Understanding the Action List

- Includes the 20 lowest-scoring items
- Rate questions that you scored the lowest on based on Feasibility and Impact of implementing the recommendation with the resources you have (human, financial)
- **Feasible:** Level of difficulty and the capability to accomplish a goal or objective in terms of available time and resources
- Impact: Marked effect or influence that there is some ability to observe or ideally measure the effect on the significance to patient care and/or the ability to advance practice

- Tier 1: Substantial opportunities for improvement identified for adoption and implementation
- Tier 2: Good involvement, exploring possibilities for improvement, and steps taken to develop plans for overcoming challenges with the adoption and implementation of PAI 2030 recommendations
- Tier 3: Significant and meaningful improvement efforts to adopt and implement the PAI 2030 recommendations
- Tier 4: Intensive focus and significant commitment to achieve and sustain adoption and implementation of the recommendation
